

GREEN TRIANGLE TREEFARM PROJECT

The Project.

The Green Triangle Treefarm Project provides income to landowners for growing bluegum (*Eucalyptus globulus* subsp. *globulus*) plantations that are chipped for export through the Port of Portland.

A Green Triangle Treefarm Project "Grower Agreement" contract is produced to guarantee sale of harvested woodchip.

The first Green Triangle Treefarm Project plantings began in 1996 with harvesting and woodchip export starting in 2006.

The Green Triangle Treefarm Project accepts:

- Bare land for plantation establishment.
- Established plantations.
- Harvested plantations that can be re-planted.
- Harvested plantations that re-generate through tree stump re-growth (coppice).

The Grower will:

- Provide not less than 20 hectares of suitable land to grow bluegums for 10 – 13 years.
- Plant and maintain their plantation.

- Secure your place on the harvest schedule.
- Provide harvest, processing and transportation services.
- Provide prompt payment for harvested woodchip.
